			Find section corner to secs 1 and 12. 6 and 7 which is a stone $14 \times 12 \times 8$ inches in a mound of stone correctly marked (thus - one notch on N side and = on South side)
39.	90		The section line between 11 and 12 running up and down the face of a steep and rocky mountain making it difficult to project with any degree of certainty. I commenced at cor to secs 1 and 12 on East boundary of 10 and run west on a bearing of $180^{\circ} 30' E$
