From corner 1 to corner 3		After duly qualifying on oath Henry Hopkins and Thomas Davies as chainbearers I proceeded to make the following survey. Beginning at the N.E. corner of sec 1 Township 14 South, Range 29 East. and running west on North boundary of section one said - Beginning of run being in bad condition and not in proper order to commence a survey from. Therefore this line will be considered a random line. Find cor corner to secs 35 and 36 as called for in L.S. Field Note. To point 50 links west of mound of stone at correct distance from the Tellan Creek. No marked stone.
3 to 5	39 40 80 00	I then commenced at mound of stone last described and run South at a magnetic variation of $20^{\circ} E$ Find no $\frac{1}{4}$ sec cor as indicated in notes of original survey Find no sec cor as indicated in original notes. place temp cor. and run
5 to 7	40 00 79 90	Thence East var $19^{\circ} E$ on random line bet secs 1 and 12 Find mound of stone and corner-stone improperly marked (thus +) on the side Find section corner to secs 1 and 12. 6 and 7 which is a stone $14 \times 12 \times 8$ inches in a mound of stone correctly marked (thus - one notch on N side and $\equiv$ on South side)
7 to 5	39 90 79 90	The section line between 11 and 12 running up and down the face of a steep and rocky mountain making it difficult to project with any degree of certainty. I commenced at cor to secs 1 and 12 on East boundary of $\frac{1}{4}$ and run west on a var of $18^{\circ} 30' E$ to $\frac{1}{4}$ cor which I find to be 5 links to far to the East but leave it in position believing it to be the original mound Close on temp cor and establish it as permanent corner, which is a basalt stone $10 \times 12 \times 21$ inches placed 6 ins in ground and stone mound raised around
5 to 3	57 80	Thence I run North var $19^{\circ} E$ and close on temp sec cor which I established for permanent corner being a basalt stone $8 \times 6 \times 12$ ins. marked with on E face and $\equiv$ on West face and CS on South side. and raised stone mound around Done in presence of Henry Hopkins and Thos Davies May 22nd 1895 J.
