

The Legal Subdivisional Line between *Thos Keeney & (Walter Keeney and his wife)* not being desirable to them they agreed and signed articles to the effect that they would not consider the Legal Subdivisional Line as their boundary. But they agreed that a certain fence should be the Boundary Line between them from this time forward. Up to this time *Thomas Keeney* owned the $W\frac{1}{2}$ of $NE\frac{1}{4}$ & NE of $NW\frac{1}{4}$ Sec 20 and *Walter Keeney* owned $S\frac{1}{2}$ of $NE\frac{1}{4}$ and $SE\frac{1}{4}$ of $NW\frac{1}{4}$ Sec 20. Town 10 S R 3 E

The original Agreement was placed on file and recorded in the County Clerk's office

These field notes show the Position in relation to the NE Corner Sec 20 and the courses and distances of the fence, which they agreed should be their Line

Beginning at a point on the Line or East boundary of Sec 20, and at a distance South of NE Corner of Sec 20 20 ch. Marked a Solid Red Rock + CS and Witnessed by 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ Pines as follows
From this point a $\frac{1}{2}$ Pine ^{30 inch dia} bears $N 72.15' W$ 6.10 ch

" " " " " 20 inch dia Bears $N 56' W$ 4.95

Fence Blazed and Marked W.T.C.S. Old Fence which is to be the Boundary, over this Point,

Thence $S 88.30' W$ To Yellow Pine ^{30 inch dia} to which the fence is attached. We noticed this tree on East W side

Thence $N 85.30' W$ along the fence

Thence $S 89' W$ " " "

Thence $S 28.30' W$

Thence $N 77' W$ along side the Old Rail fence

Cross Creek " " " " " "

East side Saw Mill " " " " " "

Top of Rice wharf " " " " " "

South fork Long Creek

Cottonwood tree noticed on East side from this tree which stands in an angle of the fence. The fence runs away to the North. And the boundary between the parties is to be continued on from this tree as the East and longest line of fence or $N 77' W$ to the intersection of the Legal Subdivisional Line of this Sec running North and South as shown in Plat Surveyed with Solar Compass, Var 21.20 All Bearings are recorded from the true Mer
