John Tracy appeared on scene. Mr E H Goss was notified

May 10 1909 I proceeded to the SW Corner Sec 10 Twp 14 Range 31 E

at one o'clock James Kane W H Smith & A Prince Sworn as Flagman by Chain carrier
Ed Cain appointed Surveyor. Being informed that all of the original Corners of Sec 10 were missing except the SW I began at SW Corner which is in good condition with the Witness Trees as described in U.S. Field notes

Sec Corner missing stones on side of steep hill in a field of loose rocks cut by stock trails
I then followed Sec Surveyor Instructions to use Natural objects described in U.S. Field Notes as a means of Locating the SE Corner Sec 10. The difference between our measure and Government measure from SW Cor Sec 10 to Canyon Creek being .85 lbs I proceeded to temp 8 E Cor Sec 10 and corrected it 43 links East

Now proceed to Corner 14-15-22-23 which is in good condition with

The NW Cor Sec 2. Found this Corner being used as fence weight on Geo Sollinger fence
Mr Ed Cain testified to seeing this Corner North of its present position (ie fence weight)
about 35 lbs a pile of rocks were stoned with a place in centre as if a Corner had been removed. I placed it there, and corroborated Ed Cain's testimony by taking observations on Corners 3 miles East on standard parallel with which I was acquainted
and finally ran East

The Cor Sec 34-35 Twp 13 S R 31 E without any falling

Then to corroborate with the parallel corners West I ran West from the Closing Corner Sec 2-3 Twp 14 R 31. We proceeded West measuring carefully and found no corner either Closing or Standard along the line until we came to Standard Corner Sec 36 Twp 13 R 30. My opinion is that we would not have found this had it not been perfectly concealed by Brush and Chick Marks down underneath falling North 27 links
Mr Cain's testimony having been thus satisfactory corroborated I proceeded to Temp N E Cor Sec 10 and corrected it North 72.8 lbs (its proper amount of the proportion of difference) Have to say that finding there was a difference of 10 lbs between our measurement and Government from Corner 14-15-22-23 and Closing Cor Sec 2-3 I remeasured to make sure and found no mistake
