Dear Sir:

Recently I had occasion to locate the $1/4$ section corner described below. Originally two bearing trees were set both of which are now cut above the original scribe marks leaving legible scribing on both the upper and lower blazes. To insure the perpetuation of this corner, two new bearing trees were marked. A transcription of the original field notes describing bearing trees and corner follows:

Subdivision of T. 18 S., R. 32 E.

Surveyed by Reuben R. Leigh, Deputy Surveyor under
Contract No. 489, Dated August 15, 1883.

For quarter section cor. common to sections 3 and 4

"Set a basalt stone 16 x 6 x 6 ins., 10 ins. in the ground,
for $1/4$ sec. cor. mkd. $1/4$ on W. face from which a pine,
60 ins. diam. bears N. 10° E. 182 lks. dist. mkd $1/4$ S. BT.
A Pine, 40 ins. diam bears N. 8° W, 134 lks. dist. mkd. $1/4$
S. BT.

A description of the new bearing trees follows:

From $1/4$ sec. cor. stone 16 x 6 x 6 marked $1/4$ on W. face.
A pine 14 inches diam. bears S $18^{\circ} 45'$ E a dist. of 98.5 links.
A pine 12 inches diam. bears S $41^{\circ} 30'$ W a dist. of 57.5 links.
