Survey no 2, made on application of Mrs Ellen Fields, to establish boundaries of lots 3 and 4, Sec 3, and lots 1 and 2, Sec 4, on north Bdy of tracts, and to establish the cor between Sec's 3 and 4, and the 1/4 sec cor of sec 4, on north Bdy, all in T<sub>14</sub> S R 25 E. W W.

After qualifying on oath Joe Hodson and J. Williams as chainman, and Frank Fields, as flagman.

I commenced <sup>at</sup> the cor to Secs 2 and 3, which is a lava rock 10 x 8 x 6 ins, in mound of rock, <sup>marked with 4 notches on W end 2 notches on E face.</sup> Thence I run N 89° 46' W, var 20° 10' E.

6.1 Cross small brook running N and S.  
37.2 1/4 Sec Cor, identical with the NE cor of lot 3 in Sec 3.

78.4 Cor to Sec's 3 and 4, established by proportionate measurement, from total distance from the cor to Secs 2 and 3, to the 1/4 cor on north Bdy of Sec 4. A Basalt rock 12 x 10 x 8 ins, set in mound of rock, marked with 3 notches on the East, and 3 notches on West face.

Thence N 89° 53' W, on N. Bdy Sec 3. var 20° 15' E  
22.3 Cross Moon Creek, flowing N and S.

37.2 To 1/4 Sec cor, on north Bdy Sec 4, identical with the N.W. cor of lot 2, a Lava Boulder 16 x 12 x 10 in with no distinguishable marks, but established it as the 1/4 cor, upon the sworn testimony of Joseph Hodson, who testified that he was a member of the original survey in ~~force~~ force, and that this rock was placed at this spot ~~for~~ by the Surveyor, as the Corner.
