

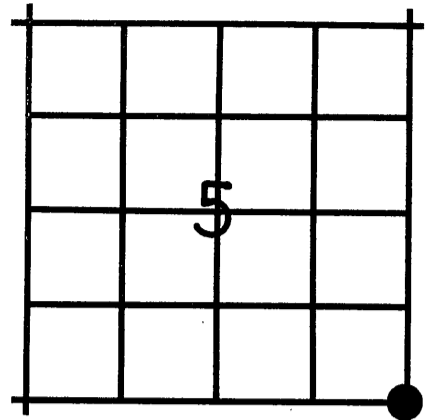

### ORIGINAL DESCRIPTION:

Set a post for cor. to secs. 4, 5, 8, & 9.  
 Pine 18 ins. dia. bears S. 40° E. 14 lks. dist.  
 Pine 18 ins. dia. bears N. 12° E. 23 lks. dist.  
 Pine 20 ins. dia. bears S. 15° W. 13 1/4 lks. dist.  
 Pine 12 ins. dia. bears N. 31° W. 178 lks. dist.

### EVIDENCE FOUND:

No evidence of the original corner post was found. The corner position is established at record bearing and distance from the one original remaining bearing tree in section 4.

From the corner point:

A Ponderosa Pine, 28 ins. diam., bears N. 12° E., 15.2 ft., scribed 4 in partially healed blaze that had been opened by others. This tree is alive and well.

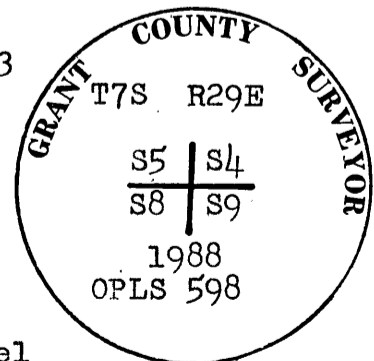
### DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENTS AND ACCESSORIES SET AND METHODS USED:

Show how trees are scribed and basis of bearings, including compass var.

At the corner point: Set a 1 1/2" x 30" galvanized iron pipe 28 inches in the ground, with brass cap marked as shown, from which I scribe NEW BT's:

MONUMENT MARKED

- A Ponderosa Pine, 14 ins. diam., bears S. 71° E., 36.3 ft., marked T7S R29E S9 CSBT.
- A Ponderosa Pine, 16 ins. diam., bears S. 21° W., 32.2 ft., marked T7S R29E S8 CSBT.
- A Ponderosa Pine, 18 ins. diam., bears N. 71° W., 26.3 ft., marked T7S R29E S5 CSBT.



Attached County Surveyor BT tags to all BT's, and painted new BT blazes with red tree marking paint. Used magnetic compass with 20° E. variation and steel tape, measuring dist. to a 40d nail driven in side center of new BT's. at root crown.

I surrounded monument with a mound of stone.
