

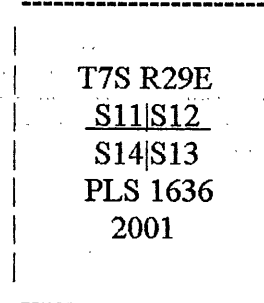
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

J - 21
DIAGRAM

History of original corner establishment:

The original corner was established by Frank W. Campbell on May 8, 1881, under GLO contract No. 380, as follows:

Set a basalt stone, 16" x 8" x 6", in a mound of stones for cor. to sec's. 11, 12, 13 & 14, from which a:
Pine 60" dia. bears S82° E, 109 links (71.94 feet).



Corner evidence recovered:

Found the corner stone loosely set in a mound of stones. The corner stone is 14" x 10" x 6" and is marked with five notches on the sharpest edge, from which:

A 59" by 30 foot high Ponderosa Pine buckskin snag with scribes, "T7S R29 S12", visible on a partly healed upper blaze, lower blaze healed shut, bears S81° E, 71.94 feet to the face of the blaze.

Monument and accessories established to perpetuate the original position of this corner:

In place of the original corner stone, I set a 1" x 30" flared, galvanized iron pipe 24" into the ground. I bury the corner stone to the south side of the pipe and build a small mound of stones around the pipe. A 2 1/2" brass cap attached to the top of the pipe is marked as shown in the diagram above, from which:

- A 11" Ponderosa Pine, scribed "T7S R29E S12 BT", bears N65° E, 19.3 feet.
- A 23" Ponderosa Pine, scribed "T7S R29E S13 BT", bears S30° E, 50.3 feet.
- A 20" Ponderosa Pine, scribed "T7S R29E S14 BT", bears S39° W, 40.0 feet.
- A 24" Ponderosa Pine, scribed "T7S, R29E S11 BT", bears N64° W, 56.5 feet.

The new bearing trees are scribed on double blazes and have a 3/4" brass washer, marked "PLS 1636", nailed flush to the bottom of the lower blaze.

I hereby certify the above corner point was perpetuated as hereon described on July 13, 2001. Magnetic declination set in compass: 18° E.
