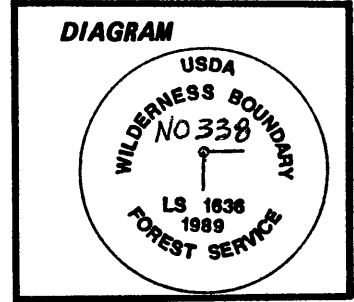


CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:

Description of monument and accessories established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:



North Fork John Day Wilderness. North Fork John Day Unit. Point Number 338.

This point is located in the SW 1/4 of section 2, T 7 S, R 33 E.

In a small draw and 500 feet southeasterly of the centerline of forest service road 5507 as described in the wilderness boundary description, set a 2 1/2 inch by 30 inch flared aluminum pipe 24 inches into the ground with a 3 inch aluminum cap attached. The cap is marked as shown in the diagram above. From which:

- A 16 inch Douglas-fir bears S 4° W, 29.8 feet (on the east side of the draw).
- A 15 inch Douglas-fir bears S 38° W, 22.2 feet (on the west side of the draw).

Both trees are scribed "WB/338 BT" on a single blaze and have a 3/4 inch brass washer, marked "PLS 1636", nailed flush to the lower portion of the blaze. Both trees have a "Bearing Tree" sign and a "Land Survey Monument" sign attached.
