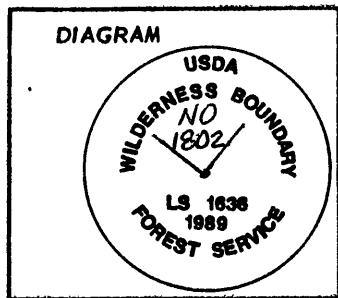


CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner

North Fork John Day Wilderness, North Fork John Day Unit, Point Number 1802

This point is located in the SE 1/4 of section 15, T. 8 S., R. 35 1/2 E.

At the confluence of Lucas Gulch and an unnamed draw as described in the wilderness boundary description, set a 2 1/2 inch by 30 inch flared aluminum pipe, with a 3 inch aluminum cap attached, 20 inches into the ground surrounded by a small mound of stones. The cap is marked as shown in the diagram above. From which:

- A 15 inch Engelmann Spruce bears S 17° 30' W, 22.2 feet.
- A 8 inch White Fir bears N 24° 30' W, 13.2 feet.

Both trees are scribed "WB/1802 BT" on a single blaze and have a 3/4 inch brass washer, marked "PLS 1636", nailed flush to the lower portion of the blaze. Both trees are signed with a "Bearing Tree" and an "Attention" sign. The White Fir bearing tree is additionally signed with a 27-6a, "Wilderness Boundary", sign.
