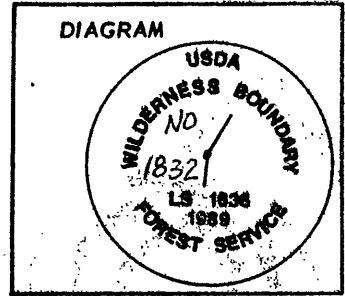

North Fork John Day Wilderness, North Fork John Day Unit, Point Number 1832:

This point is located in the NE 1/4 of section 24, T. 8 S., R. 35 E.

At a high point on a ridge as described in the wilderness boundary description, set a 2 1/2 inch by 30 inch flared aluminum pipe, with a 3 inch aluminum cap attached, 20 inches into the ground. The cap is marked as shown in the diagram above. From which:

A 12 inch Douglas fir bears S 16° W, 25.1 feet.

A 10 inch Western Larch bears N 64° W, 18.3 feet.

Both trees are scribed "WB/1332 BT" on a single blaze and have a 3/4 inch brass washer, marked "PLS 1636", nailed flush to the lower portion of the blaze. Both trees are signed with a "Bearing Tree" and a "Land Survey Monument" sign.
