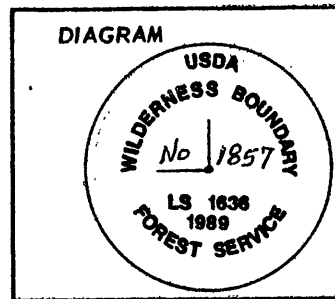


CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

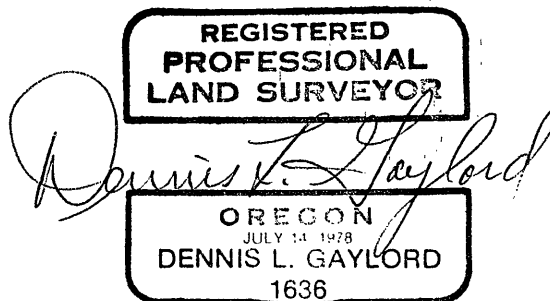
History of original corner establishment:

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner

North Fork John Day Wilderness, North Fork John Day Unit, Point Number 1857

At a point in a minor draw and on the east-west centerline of the SE 1/4 of section 24, T. 8 S., R. 35 E., this line having been surveyed, monumented and posted in August, 1987 by Duane Griffith, LS 644, set a 2 1/2 inch by 30 inch aluminum pipe, with a 3 inch aluminum cap attached, 20 inches into the ground. The cap is marked as shown in the diagram. This point is approximately 425 feet west of the S 1/16 corner on the east line of section 24. From which:

- A 14 inch Engelmann Spruce bears N 14° W, 19.9 feet.
- A 7 inch Engelmann Spruce bears S 80° W, 34.7 feet.

Both trees are scribed "WB/1857 BT" on a single blaze and have a 3/4 inch brass washer, marked "PLS 1636", nailed flush to the lower portion of the blaze. Both trees are signed with a "Bearing Tree" and a "Land Survey Monument" sign.
