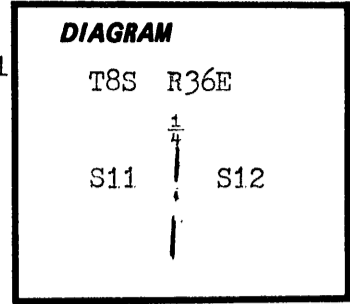


CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

G-21

History of original corner establishment:

This corner was originally established by Otis Gould, U.S. Cadastral Surveyor, under special instructions dated Nov. 27, 1935, during his surveys in July through October, 1937. The original notes state that at the corner a marked brass cap on a 1" by 3' long iron post was set 37" in the ground from which:



- A spruce, 20" diam., bears N.80°E., 14 lks. dist., marked 1/4 S12 BT.
- A fir, 10" diam., bears S.72°W., 57 lks. dist., marked 1/4 S11 BT.

Description of corner evidence found:

A 2 1/2" brass cap on a 1" galvanized iron pipe protruding 24" from the ground and 15" from a stone mound from which:

A 30" englemann spruce bears N.75°E-8.2' with healed blaze.

The corner is located on a logged, east facing hillside about 50" East of old road and 250' East of tailings. Walk to corner from SW corner S12.

Description of monument and accessories established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

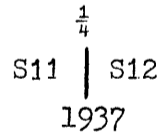
Maintained monument by shaping a mound of earth and stone around it. From the monument:

A 8" englemann spruce bears N77 1/2°W-11.0', scribed 1/4 S11 BT.

New bearing tree has a brass washer stamped PLS 1106 nailed to the face of blaze. Attached sign 54-3 and 54-9 and painted face of blaze and a 6" red band around each bearing tree. Set steel fence post North of corner and attached sign 54-9.

Used steel tape and staff compass with 19° E declination, measured to the center of the bearing trees.

The cap is a standard GLO brass cap marked:



This corner was maintained on July 25, 1986.
