

NARRATIVE OF SURVEY

THE PURPOSE OF THIS SURVEY WAS TO LOCATE AND POST THE BOUNDARY BETWEEN PRIVATE LANDS AND PUBLIC LANDS ADMINISTERED BY THE US.D.A. - MALHEUR NATIONAL FOREST. ORIGINAL AND LINE INTERSECTION CORNERS MARKING THE EXTERIORS OF MS 478, 479, AND 5GG, AND PORTIONS OF MS 47G AND MS SIG, WERE REMONUMENTED, OR ESTABLISHED AND MONUMENTED, AS SHOWN ON THIS PLAT. THE COMMON BOUNDARY WAS POSTED WITH G FOOT STEEL OR WOOD POSTS WITH NATIONAL FOREST BOUNDARY SIGNS 54-2 ATTACHED.

IT SHOULD BE NOTED THAT SMALL PARCELS OF PUBLIC LAND MAY EXIST WITHIN THE EXTERIORS OF THE CLAIMS, A RESULT OF GAPS BETWEEN PATENTED CLAIMS. NO ATTEMPT WAS MADE ON THIS SURVEY TO DETERMINE THE EXISTENCE OF THESE SMALL PARCELS OF PUBLIC LAND.

IN THE SAME GENERAL AREA AS MS 47G, MS 40Z WAS PERFORMED IN JUNE, 1900, BY CHAS. M. FOSTER. THE CLAIM OWNERS, THE BAOGER GOLD MINING AND MILLING CO., WERE NOT SATISFIED WITH MS 40Z AND PETITIONED THE SURVEYOR GENERAL FOR A NEW SURVEY. THE NEW SURVEY WAS MS 47G, AND PATENT WAS ISSUED, BASED ON MS 47G IN JUNE, 1904. MANY OF THE CORNERS OF MS 40Z, AND THE CORNER ACCESSORIES, STILL EXIST AS OF THE DATE OF THIS SURVEY.

FIELD WORK WAS DONE WITH A 2-PERSON CREW USING ZO- AND G-SECOND THEODOLITES AND INFRA-RED DISTANCE MEASURING EQUIPMENT. AS INDICATED ON THIS PLAT, BEARINGS ARE BASED ON A SOLAR OBSERVATION TAKEN AT THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 5, T. 108., R. 33 E., W.M.

ALL ORIGINAL CORNERS REQUIRED FOR DEFINING THE POSTED NATIONAL FOREST BOUNDARY WERE RECOVERED WITH THE EXCEPTION OF KING OF THE HILLS CORNER 3, MS 478. THESE CORNERS WERE DECLARED LOST AFTER DILIGENT SEARCH AND WERE RE-ESTABLISHED AS FOLLOWS:

KING OF THE HILLS CORNER 3:
RE-ESTABLISHED CORNER BY COMPASS RULE ADJUSTMENT METHOD BETWEEN
RECOVERED KING OF THE HILLS CORNERS 2 AND 4, AFTER FIRST ROTATING RECORD
CALCULATED BEARING BETWEEN CORNERS 2 AND 4 TO OBSERVED BEARING.

LONE STAR CORNER 3:
RE-ESTABLISHED CORNER BY SURVEY FROM MOCKING BIRD CORNER I, MS 478, BY
MEASURING RECORD ANGLE FROM MOCKING BIRD LINE 2-1, AND MEASURING
RECORD TIE DISTANCE TO LONE STAR CORNER 3.

THIS SURVEY IS LOCATED IN SECTIONS 5, G, T AND 8, TOWNSHIP IO SOUTH, RANGE 33 EAST, W.M., GRANT COUNTY, OREGON.
