General Notes:

All monuments and bearing trees are entered in this survey and entered as per G.W. Manual of Surveying Instructions, 1873, unless otherwise noted. All field notes for this survey are on file in the office of George Cahin.

All Carvers monumented have a Certified Record of Land Carver Monumentation Form CD-1100-517 on file in the County Surveyor's office along with this plat.

The plot identifies the alphanumeric index file number of the O-7100-57 for each carrier, which by reference is made a part of this plot.

New BTs are marked with blue
flags marked 25, 1000 miles on
BT base. Measurements to BTs
are taken to sub-center or
near center. Red bands are
painted at least 1 foot around
each new BT with BT sign above
base and land survey monument
sign on back of each BT. Bearings
to BTs were taken with a magnetic
tape compass with declination
set at 20 East.

NARRATIVE

The purpose of this survey was to mark the corners and pass the boundary between private and National Forest Sudden Lands. Control was established by a random, closed traverse with a precision of 1/25,000. Barring was accomplished by offsetting from said random traverse to true line. Where random spacing was inadequate, points on line were set to offset from. All corners established were set from original evidence. The East 1/4 corner of Sec. 5 was not tied in on this survey and the course shown along the West line is from the SE corner to the NE corner of said Sec. 5. No problems were encountered and the survey was completed in May 1989.
