

Except as the modified lot 5, section 7, is shown hereon, the lottings and areas are as shown on the plat approved September 28, 1884.

The west boundary was surveyed by William H. Byars, in 1873. A portion of the subdivisional lines were surveyed by William R. Gradon, in 1884. The south boundary of T. 11 S., R. 28 E., was resurveyed in 1962, as shown upon the plat accepted August 20, 1964.
