
A PARCEL OF LAND LOCATED IN NE1/4 SE1/4, SECTION 1, T.13S., R.26E., W.M.

PROPERTY LINE ADJUSTMENT



NARRATIVE

The purpose of this survey was to adjust the property line of two adjoining owners. This survey was conducted at the request of the Town of Dayville for the purpose of a land exchange between the Town of Dayville and the adjoining owners Michael S. and Denise B. Smith.

In 1988 this surveyor conducted a survey for the Town of Dayville (Grant Co. Map of Survey No. 1050) and at that time located the proposed property line adjustment.

During the course of time one of the 5/8" rebars established in 1988 has disappeared. I re-established and remonumented the missing rebar during the course of this survey as shown on this map of survey.

The basis of bearing for this survey was determined from Grant County Map of Survey No. 1050. The field notes and computations for this survey are on file at the office of Ferguson Surveying and Engineering, Mt. Vernon, Oregon 97865.
