20" Fir Snag, N 36 3/4° E, 31.8 feet, with scribing "BT MS650A MC 368 G2" "BT" visible on double blaze and 3/4" brass washer stamped "PLS 1106" nailed to lower blaze.

Burnt out Western Larch Stump, S 81 1/4° E, 16.8 feet.



Found a 2 1/2" aluminum pipe, with a 3 1/4" aluminum cap, projecting 10" out of the ground, marked as shown, from which:

7" Englemann Spruce, N 17° E, 27.98 feet, with scribing "WP S11" "BT" visible on double blaze.
5" White Fir, N 12 3/4° W, 6.0 feet, with scribing "WP S10" "BT" visible on double blaze.
Both BT's have a 3/4" brass washer stamped "RLS 2308' nailed to the lower blaze.

C2 Climax Corner No. 2 — MS 342

Found a 2 1/2" iron pipe, with a 3" brass cap, projecting 5" out of the ground, marked as shown, from which:

14" Wind thrown Lodgepole Pine Snag, N 21 1/4° E, 135.9 feet, with scribing "BT MS342 02" "BT" visible on double blaze and 3/4" brass washer stamped "PLS 1106" nailed to the lower blaze.
Remains of a stump, N 82 1/4° E, 60.6 feet, with faint scribing visible.
22" Englemann Spruce, N 87 1/4° E, 61.5 feet, with scribing visible on almost completely healed double blaze. 8" stump, S 85 1/2° E, 62.7 feet, with no marks visible.



12" Lodgepole Pine Snag, N 75 1/4° W, 55.0 feet, with scribing "BT MS601 NP1" "BT" visible on double blaze and 3/4" brass washer stamped "PLS 1106" nailed to the lower blaze.
11" Lodgepole Pine, N 40 1/2° W, 23.6 feet, with scribing "BT MS601 NP1" "BT" visible on a double blaze.

13" Douglas Fir, S 50 1/4° E, 51.4 feet, with scribing "BT MS601 NP2" "BT" visible on double blaze and 3/4" brass washer stamped "PLS 1106" nailed to the lower blaze. 20" Douglas Fir, N 3 1/4° W, 20.5 feet, with scribing "BT MS601 NP2" "BT" visible on double blaze and 3/4" brass washer stamped "PLS 1106" nailed to the lower blaze.

NP3 Nye Placer Corner No. 3 - MS 601

Found a 2 1/2" iron pipe, with a 3" brass cap, projecting 6" out of the ground and surrounded by a ring of stones, marked as shown, from which:

Root hole with wind thrown 4" Lodgepole Pine Snag, N 44° E, 39.5 feet, with scribing "X" "BT" visible on double blaze.

21" Douglas Fir, S 6° W, 54.6 feet, with scribing "MS MS601 NP3" "BT" visible on double blaze facing N 25° W. Both BT's have a 3/4" brass washer stamped "PLS 1106" nailed to the lower blaze.

New BT:

6" Douglas Fir, S 36 1/2° E, 8.5 feet, scribed "MS601 NP3" "BT".

NP4 Nye Placer Corner No. 4 - MS 601

Found a 2 1/2" iron pipe, with a 3" brass cap, projecting 5" out of the ground and surrounded by a ring of stones, marked as shown, from which:

16" Englemann Spruce, S 38 3/4° E, 6.4 feet, with healed \double blaze.
17" Englemann Spruce, S 74 3/4° W, 21.0 feet, with healed double blaze.

Nve Placer Corner No. 5 - MS 601

Found a 2 1/2" iron pipe, with a 3" brass cap, projecting 4" out of the ground and surrounded by a ring of stones, marked as shown, from which:

14" Douglas Fir, N 88 1/2° E, 9.3 feet, with scribing visible on a partially healed double blaze.

18" Ponderosa Pine, S 4 3/4° W, 31.8 feet, with healed blaze facing the corner and scribing visible on a partially healed double blaze facing N 50° W.
