
Survey For Umatilla National Forest AP-2265 to AP-2266 and AP-2287 to AP-2289 North Fork John Day Unit North Fork John Day Wilderness Located in Section 35, Township 8 South, Range 35 East, Willamette Meridian Grant County, Oregon October - November, 1999



The purpose of this survey was to monument and mark the North Fork John Day Unit of the North Fork John Day Wilderness from AP-2265 to AP-2266 and from AP-2287 to AP-2289.

1884, Herman D. Gradon, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, subdivided Townships 8 and 9 South, Range 35 East under General Land Office contract number 499

1900, Ira L. Hoffman (Deeds Book Q Page 453) and C. C. Berkeley (Deeds Book R Page 57) surveyed the town site of Lawton (currently vacated) located in portions of section 36, T. 8 S., R. 35 E., and section 2, T. 9 S., R. 35 E.

1965, Donald L. Staebler, Professional Engineer No. 5408, performed a property survey in sections 26, 27, 28, 35 & 36, T. 8 S., R. 35 E., and sections 1 & 2, T. 9 S., R. 35 E. (Grant County Map of Survey No. 924).

1971, Donald L. Staebler, Professional Engineer No. 5408, performed a metes and bounds land survey with easements in section 2, T. 9 S., R. 35 E. (Grant County Map of Survey No.

1978 — 1979, William L. Hanley, Registered Land Surveyor No. 1639, remonumented the corner of sections 35 and 36, T. 8 S., R. 35 E., while surveying section 1, T. 9 S., R. 35 E. (Grant County Map of Survey No. 575).

1982 — 1984, Gary L. Langlitz, Registered Land Surveyor No. 1099, surveyed sections 27, 28 & 35, T. 8 S., R. 35 E., and section 2, T. 9 S., R. 35 E. (Grant County Map of Survey No.

1984, The North Fork John Day Wilderness was entered into the National Wilderness Preservation System.

1987, The legal boundary description of the North Fork John Day Wilderness, North Fork John Day Unit is approved by the Regional Forester of the Pacific Northwest Region.

1998, Robert D. Bagett, Registered Land Surveyor No. 598, surveyed a portion of the SW1/4 of section 36, T. 8 S., R. 35 E. (Grant County Map of Survey No. 1489).

NARRATIVE:

1999, Robert D. Bagett, Registered Land Surveyor No. 598, surveyed the vacated town site of Lawton, located in Lot 1 and the SW1/4 of the NE1/4 of section 2, T. 9 S., R. 35 E. (Grant County Map of Survey No. 1518).

PROCEDURES:

The description utilized to locate the Wilderness Boundary was obtained from the permanent open 2320 files located in the Supervisor's Office of the Umatilla National Forest located in Pendleton, Oregon.

AP-2266 (567150) was established on the East - West Centerline of the SE 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of section 35 at a point 200 feet westerly of and perpendicular to the main thread of Granite Creek. AP-2287 (600117) was established on the section line between sections 35 & 36 at a point 200 feet southwesterly of and perpendicular to the main thread of Granite creek.

During the course of this survey a timber operator's spur road was found to encroach into the wilderness. This road which is still driveable predates the creation of the wilderness.

This survey was conducted using a Topcon GTS-4 Total Station. The basis of bearing for this survey is the record bearing from the corner of sections 35 and 36 (600100) to a 5/8" rebar with a yellow plastic cap marked "BGB SURVEY MARKER" (600106) set by Robert D. Bagett in 1998 (Grant County Map of Survey No. 1489).

The Wilderness Boundary was posted by setting 6 foot steel fence posts with attached "Property Boundary" and "Wilderness Boundary" signs within one foot of the surveyed boundary.

Bearing trees were tied using the Topcon GTS-4 Total Station and distance measurements were taken at side center one foot above the root crown. All new bearing trees are double blazed and have a 3/4 inch diameter brass washer stamped "RLS 2308" nailed to the lower blaze near the "BT" scribing.

Field books for this survey are on file at the Supervisor's Office of the Umatilla National Forest located at Pendleton. Oregon.


