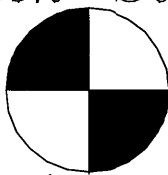


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GRANT COUNTY MAP OF SURVEY 1746 SURVEYOR'S REPORT

DECEMBER, 2005

The purpose of this report is to clarify and support the acceptance and use of certain public land survey monuments, as outlined below, during the survey for the location of the record boundary lines of the property as described in Grant County Deed Instrument #20042298, more particularly, the subdivision of Section 14, T.13S., R.28E., W.M.

HISTORY OF SURVEYS

The Original Survey was performed by William H. Byars, under GLO contract No. 197, dated July 14, 1873.

In November of 1913, Vernon Glaze, Grant County Surveyor Performed a Survey for J. C. Moore.

In June-July 1914, Vernon Glaze, Grant County Surveyor performed a survey for the Eastern Oregon Land Company.

The OREGON STATE HIGHWAY DIVISION shows ties to the SE corner and the East 1/4 corner of said Section 14 on its drawing titled "E. UNIT, DAYVILLE - MT. VERNON SECTION", Drg. No. 7B-20-5, dated March, 1953.

The OREGON DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION shows ties by coordinates for the W1/4 Corner, the E1/4 Corner, the SE Section Corner and the SW Section Corner of said Section 14 on its drawing titled "FLAT CREEK-FIELDS CREEK SECTION, JOHN DAY HIGHWAY" Drg. No. 8B-28-3, dated February 1963.

Subsequent surveys that relate to this partition are Grant County Maps of Survey No.s 393, 618 and 1374, all filed by Robert Bagett.
